

Marriages: Marriages are celebrated in the Church where the bride or groom is registered at. When a man and a woman plan to marry each other, they should contact a priest one year in advance and always before the wedding date is set, and before arranging for the reception hall. The engaged are required to attend a Marriage Preparation Course.

Please note: However, if this man or woman has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted. Questions are often being asked about marriages performed outside the Catholic Church by non-Catholic ministers. These are not valid marriages according to the teaching of the Catholic Church, but many can be rectified by simply consulting with your Parish priest to discuss the available options. Sometimes people make decisions without proper information, so if you wish, please contact your Pastor for details or call the Marriage Tribunal at 416-934-3400 ext 300.

TRIUMPH OF THE CROSS - September 14

The cross, formerly a symbol of punishment and death, has been exalted by Jesus as the stairway to paradise. As St. Paul said: We proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are called, Jews and Greek alike, Christ the power of and the wisdom of God (1 Corinthians 1:23-24). There can be no Christian without the cross. As Jesus said: Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross every day, and follow me (Luke 9:23). The feast of the Triumph of the Holy Cross is connected with the recovery of the sacred relic in 629.

After the placing of Jesus in the tomb, his cross was thrown into a ditch and covered with stones and earth, so that the Christians might not find it. In 326, St. Helena, mother of Constantine the Great, discovered the hiding place and solemnly enshrined the cross in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. In 614, the Persians invaded Palestine and carried off that precious relic. In 629, Emperor Heraclitus of Constantinople defeated the Persians and brought back the Sacred Cross to Jerusalem. He wanted to carry the cross personally, but at the city gate he was not able to go forward. Patriarch Zachary, who walked by his side, suggested that his imperial splendor was in disagreement with the humble appearance of Christ. Accordingly, clothed in sackcloth and barefoot he was able to replace the cross where it was before.

APOSTATING INTO DARKNESS

Emperor Constantine's death in 331 led to his son Constantine II becoming Roman emperor. The fearful Constantine II purged his family of potential political rivals, having his uncles and most of his male cousins executed. One of the survivors was the six year old Julian. The shock of this familial slaughter scarred Julian; though baptized, he grew to reject the Christian Faith, to which his family's murderers belonged.

Julian himself became emperor in 361. At first, he hid his apostasy, though before long it became the driving force behind his imperial decisions. He hated Christianity, yet in his vengeance he ironically helped strengthen Christian orthodoxy. Arianism, though condemned as a heresy at the Council of Nicaea in 325, remained influential thanks to official political support by Julian's "Christian" relatives. Julian removed that political protection and brought orthodox bishops back from exile. His hope was that the warring Christian factions would annihilate each other; instead, orthodox Christians were able to reestablish the Church in the Empire.

Julian also attempted to attack Christianity by undermining Christ Himself. The emperor sought to prove Christ a fraud by rebuilding the Temple in Jerusalem. Since Christians saw Christ as the fulfillment of the Jerusalem Temple and the sacrifices therein (see, for example, the Letter to the Hebrews), rebuilding the Temple would show, at least in Julian's mind, that the whole Christian affair was not worth the wood of the cross.

From the start, the venture was fraught with disaster. Earthquakes stalled the work, yet Julian's workers continued; fireballs which erupted from the base of the Temple, however, were more than they could endure. Julian soon abandoned the project. Christ remained the Victor, and His flock drew strength from this spiritual victory. This strength came out clearly during the short persecution Julian launched against Christians just before his death in 363.

So we see the way of vengeance. Julian let his anger ferment over the decades until it burst forth, raging against Christ and his Church. In as much as he embraced this rage, he and his mission failed. Julian the Apsotate's last words: "Christ you have won!"


