

Marriages: Marriages are celebrated in the Church where the bride or groom is registered at. When a man and a woman plan to marry each other, they should contact a priest one year in advance and always before the wedding date is set, and before arranging for the reception hall. The engaged are required to attend a Marriage Preparation Course.

Please note: However, if this man or woman has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted. Questions are often being asked about marriages performed outside the Catholic Church by non-Catholic ministers. These are not valid marriages according to the teaching of the Catholic Church, but many can be rectified by simply consulting with your Parish priest to discuss the available options. Sometimes people make decisions without proper information, so if you wish, please contact your Pastor for details or call the Marriage Tribunal at 416-934-3400 ext 300.

<u>During the Easter Season Fr. Paul would like to visit all those who during the year receive Holy Communion from our Eucharistic Ministers.</u>

DO YOU KNOW WHAT EASTER DUTY MEANS?

"Paschal Tide is the period during which every member of the faithful who has attained the year of discretion is bound by the positive law of the Church to receive Holy Communion and go to Confession (Easter duty). Since the Synod of Agde (508), it was customary to receive Holy Communion at least 3 times a year--Christmas, Easter, Pentecost. A positive precept was issued by the Fourth Lateran Council (1215), confirmed by the Council of Trent (Sess. XIII, can. ix). According to these decrees the faithful, after coming to the age of discretion, must receive at least at Easter the Sacrament of the Eucharist (unless by the advice of the parish priest they abstain for a while). Otherwise during life they are to be prevented from entering the church and when dead are to be denied Christian burial." Catholic Encyclopedia, Paschal Tide. •"Lest any be kept away from Communion by the fear that the requisite preparation is too hard and laborious, the faithful are frequently to be reminded that they are all bound to receive the Holy Eucharist. Furthermore, the Church has decreed that whoever neglects to approach Holy Communion once a year, at Easter, is liable to sentence of excommunication." Humility and purity are the wings which carry us to God and make us almost divine.

In the spiritual life, you must take one step forward each day in a vertical line, from the bottom up.

HERE'S WHY LENT WAS CREATED

It served as a pivotal time of preparation for adults being baptized at the Easter Vigil. Lent wasn't part of the liturgy of the Church in the very earliest years. The season and the practices associated with it have developed over time. However, this development did start very early on. The Church quickly saw a need for a final time of preparation for catechumens desiring to be baptised at the Easter Vigil.

In the early Church most converts were adults, and in order to be baptized into the Christian faith, they had to undergo a rigorous period of preparation. It could take several years before an individual was permitted to be baptized, as the Church wanted to ensure that the person was spiritually ready for such a radical life change.

After a long period of instruction in the Catholic faith and a thorough examination, according to the Catholic Encyclopedia, "their names were inscribed among the *competentes;* ie. those seeking to be baptized."

This meant they were on the "home stretch" before baptism, but there was one last period of preparation. Lent "was the time when the three-fold preparation – instructive, ascetical, and liturgical – was carried on. The ascetical preparation was severe. Prayer and fasting naturally formed part of it; but the *competentes* were also exhorted to keep silence as far as possible, (and) Confession was also enjoined.

In imitation of this period, the Church has recently instituted a similar stage in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults called the "period of Purification and Enlightenment." The Association for Catechumenal Ministry explains what is involved in this final stage.

During this period of purification and enlightenment, the focus becomes a stronger emphasis on the spiritual and mystical life in preparation for the sacraments. The guidelines for this period (which normally coincides with Lent) as well as the rites associated with them, enable catechists to shift the focus of teaching from an exposition of the Deposit of Faith to reflection and meditation.

Before they receive the sacraments of initiation, "the elect must have the intention of achieving an intimate knowledge of Christ and His Church, and they are expected particularly to progress in genuine self-knowledge through serious examination of their lives and true repentance."

For these reasons Lent became a time of spiritual preparation and was associated with a number of penitential disciplines, exhorting the catechumens to divorce themselves from a life of sin in order to adopt a new life in Jesus Christ. Eventually it became a season for all the faithful to prepare for Easter.

Lent continues to have this spiritual purification today, and even if a person is not preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil, they are encouraged to take this time to look into their hearts and see if they are truly ready to live out their Christianity to the fullest.


