

**Marriages:** Marriages are celebrated in the Church where the bride or groom is registered at. When a man and a woman plan to marry each other, they should contact a priest one year in advance and always before the wedding date is set, and before arranging for the reception hall. The engaged are required to attend a Marriage Preparation Course.

**Please note:** However, if this man or woman has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted. Questions are often being asked about marriages performed outside the Catholic Church by non-Catholic ministers. These are not valid marriages according to the teaching of the Catholic Church, but many can be rectified by simply consulting with your Parish priest to discuss the available options. Sometimes people make decisions without proper information, so if you wish, please contact your Pastor for details or call the Marriage Tribunal at 416-934-3400 ext 300.

# ST. LOUIS – August 25

St. Louis was born in 1214 and became king of France when he was only twenty-two years old. He married and became the father of eleven children who received from him careful instruction for a Christian life. He excelled in penance and prayer and in his love for the poor. While ruling his kingdom he had regard not only for peace among peoples and for the temporal good of his subjects, but also for their spiritual welfare. He undertook the Crusades to recover the tomb of Christ and died near Carthage in 1270.

### From a spiritual testament to his son by St. Louis A just king rules the earth

My dearest son, my first instruction is that you should love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your strength. Without this there is no salvation. Keep yourself, my son, from everything that you know displeases God, that is to say, from every mortal sin. You should permit yourself to be tormented by every kind of martyrdom before you would allow yourself to commit a mortal sin.

If the Lord has permitted you to have some trial, bear it willingly and with gratitude, considering that it has happened for your good and that perhaps you well desired it. If the Lord bestows upon you any kind of prosperity, thank him humbly and see that you become no worse for it, either through vain pride or anything else, because you ought not oppose God or offend him in the matter of his gifts.

Listen to the divine office with pleasure and devotion. As long as you are in church, be careful not to let your eyes wander and not to speak empty words, but pray to the Lord devoutly, either aloud or with the interior prayer of the heart.

Be kindhearted to the poor, the unfortunate and the afflicted. Give them as much help and consolation as you can. Thank God for all the benefits he has bestowed upon you, that you may be worthy to receive greater. Be just to your subjects, swaying neither to right nor left, but holding the line of justice. Always side with the poor rather than with the rich, until you are certain of the truth. See that all your subjects live in justice and peace, but especially those who have ecclesiastical rank and who belong to religious orders.

Be devout and obedient to our mother the Church of Rome and the Supreme Pontiff as your spiritual father. Work to remove all sin from your land, particularly blasphemies and heresies.

In conclusion, dearest son, I give you every blessing that a loving father can give a son. May the three Persons of the Holy Trinity and all the saints protect you from every evil. And may the Lord give you the grace to do his will so that he may be served and honoured through you, that in the next life we may together come to see him, love him and praise him unceasingly. Amen.

# MAKING SAINTS AND RELICS

All Christians are candidates for sainthood. At one time only martyrs were considered for sainthood. However, since before the 4<sup>th</sup> century, all people in heaven who lived lives of great charity and held Christian heroic virtues worthy of imitation have been candidates for sainthood.

From all walks of life and from different times in history, the trend today is to honour individuals who were active in the world of family, business and politics and showed themselves to be holy in a secular world. These men and women provide an example of overcoming hardship and living a Christian lifestyle worthy of imitation. By relating to their challenges and following their examples, we open the way of holiness for ourselves.

The canonization process consists of three steps. A pope has the ability to waive the requirement of a miracle being required prior to a potential saint's beatification, but one is required before canonization.

**Venerable** - this is the title given to a deceased person formally recognized by the pope, after review from the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, as having lived a life of heroic virtues or martyrdom.

**Blessed** - once it is established that the individual has met the requirements and is considered Venerable, to be beatified and recognized a Blessed, one miracle must be acquired through the candidate's intercession. This is a lengthy process of scrutiny.

**Saint** – in order to be made a Saint, canonization requires that a second miracle take place after the beatification.

# **Relics of Saints**

Relics are objects associated with Saints.

**First Class** – an actual body or part of a body. **Second Class** – an article of clothing or some other object used by a saint.

**Third Class** – any object that has touched a first-class relic.
