

Marriages: Marriages are celebrated in the Church where the bride or groom is registered at. When a man and a woman plan to marry each other, they should contact a priest one year in advance and always before the wedding date is set, and before arranging for the reception hall. The engaged are required to attend a Marriage Preparation Course.

Please note: However, if this man or woman has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted. Questions are often being asked about marriages performed outside the Catholic Church by non-Catholic ministers. These are not valid marriages according to the teaching of the Catholic Church, but many can be rectified by simply consulting with your Parish priest to discuss the available options. Sometimes people make decisions without proper information, so if you wish, please contact your Pastor for details or call the Marriage Tribunal at 416-934-3400 ext 300.

THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

The month of November has traditionally been dedicated to the theme of death and to those who have died. The month begins with the feast of All Saints on November 1, and the next day with the feast of All Souls.

The theme of death for November fits the natural atmosphere of the month in the northern hemisphere. The harvest is completed, a dying becomes evident throughout nature, cold weather and a hint of winter become more prevalent, the dark of night becomes more pervasive.

The faithful are encouraged to meditate upon 5 Last Things: Death, Judgement, Heaven, Hell, Eternity.

What is Heaven? The place and state of perfect happiness with God in the next life. *"Eye has not seen or ear heard, nor has it entered into the heart of man, what things God has prepared for those who love Him"* (1st Corinthians 2:9)

Who will go to Heaven? Only those who are in union with God at the moment of death. *"then the king will say to those on his right hand, 'Come, blessed of my Father, take possessions of the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world"* Matthew 25:34

How, then, should you spend your time on earth? By striving to grow in the knowledge and love of God as much as possible before you die. "Do not labour for the food that perishes, but for that which endures unto life everlasting, which the Son of Man will give you" (John 6:27). "Night is coming, when no one can work" John 9:4

Will you know your family and friends in Heaven? Yes, and also the angels and saints. "Therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but you are citizens with the saints and members of God's household" Ephesians 2:19 <u>What is hell?</u> The place and state in the next life where the souls of the damned suffer forever with the devils. "Of anyone does not abide in me, he shall be cast outside as the branch and wither; and they shall gather them up and cast them into the fire, and they shall burn" John 15:6

How do you know that there is a hell? Christ revealed the awful nature of hell. *"Then he will say to those on his left hand, 'Depart from me, accursed ones, into the everlasting fire which was prepared for the devil and his angels.' And these will go into everlasting punishment, but the just into everlasting <i>life*" Matthew 25:41-46

<u>Who will go to hell?</u> Those who die in mortal sin. Those who choose to live apart from God. "And if anyone was not found written in the book of life, he was cast into the pool of fire" Apocalypse Revelation 20:15

<u>What is purgatory?</u> A place or state of temporary punishment after death, for sinners who have damaged their union with God. *"let anyone speak against the Holy spirit and he will not be forgiven in this world or the next.*" Matthew 12:32

How do we know there is a purgatory? The Bible, the constant teaching and practice of the Catholic Church, and even common sense, prove the existence of purgatory. *"Fire will test the quality of each person's work. If his structure stands up to it, he will get his wages. If it is burnt down, he will be the loser and though he is saved himself, it will be as one who has gone through fire."* 1st Corinthians 3:14-15

How does common sense indicate the existence of purgatory? Only people with mortal sin go to hell, and on the other hand, no one can enter Heaven with the least attachment to sin. There must be a place of reparation and purification for these lesser offenses and shortcomings.

Who goes to purgatory? Those who have preserved the gift of union with God, but a) who die while guilty of unrepented venial sins b) who die without having done sufficient penance to strengthen their union with God, or their determination not to sin.

Can you help the souls in purgatory? You can help them by having Masses said for them, praying for them and doing good works for them. *"The heartfelt prayer of a good man works very powerfully."* James 5:17

Does the Bible say anything about praying for the dead? Yes. *"It is a Holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from their sins."* 2nd Machabees 12:46
