Wednesday, March 26, 2025 at 7:00pm in Sutton **Presentation of the Creed**

The Creed and the Lord's Prayer are the heart of our faith. They embody what we believe and how we are to pray, which is why special liturgies are designed to hand on or to present both in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Since the early centuries, the Creed and the Lord's Prayer have been presented to the elect in the weeks prior to Easter to help them prepare for baptism. Even today, we present them just before Easter since their baptism will be preceded by a profession of faith using the words of the Creed, and their sharing in the Eucharist will be preceded by their participation in praying the Lord's Prayer.

The Creed is presented to the Elect during the third week of Lent. It is preferable that it take place at a weekday Mass so that the community, who hands on their belief, can be present. In fact, the community is the primary minister of the presentation.

Second Scrutiny

The Second Scrutiny is a Catholic rite that takes place on the fourth Sunday of Lent. It is a time when catechumens (non-baptized people) reflect on their faith and prepare to receive the sacraments. Our parish will celebrate the Second Scrutiny on Sunday, March 30, 2025 at 10:30am Mass in Keswick

Lenten Confession

Reconciliation is such a beautiful Sacrament. Even though sin separates us from God, the gift of Reconciliation reunites us with the one divine God. It was Jesus who gave us this chance by giving his life for us.

We are called to pray, fast, and grow in faith during these 40 days of Lent. Lent is much more than just those simple ideas and it is more than just a cover; it is an entire book, and it is worth the read. You can focus on Lent as a time to prepare for the death of Jesus and what that means in your life. There are so many ways you can decide to bring yourself closer to God during this holy and spiritual time. One great fit for Lent is the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The act of confessing your sins is not only getting those sins out of the shadows but also giving God the chance to forgive them. Penance during Lent is especially important and meaningful. An important step before penance is doing an Examination of Conscience. But what is that? An Examination of Conscience is an exercise where you prayerfully consider your sins, with the intent to identify your sins and prepare yourself for a proper confession, leading to a proper penance.

You are encouraged to make time for our Parish's Lenten Day of Reconciliation. This is an opportunity to experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation in a meaningful way, to embrace this season of penance, to experience this kind of 'second baptism', right in the heart of Lent.

Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord,



<u>Tuesday, March 25</u> Today's celebration of the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord recalls the historical event of the Angel Gabriel appearing to the Virgin Mary, as found in Luke 1:26– 38. It also celebrates the Church's

faith in the underlying reality that took place at that moment in time. It celebrates the Incarnation, making this solemnity not only a Marian solemnity, but first and foremost a Christological one. Though Christmas commemorates the birth of Christ, the Annunciation commemorates the Incarnation within the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Most certainly, this solemnity is also a Marian celebration. We celebrate the Virgin Mary's perfect "Yes" to the plan of the Father. We celebrate her humility, obedience, docility, and especially her motherhood of God and man.

This solemnity is also a celebration of the Father in Heaven because it reveals the beginning of the pinnacle of His perfect plan of salvation. That moment in time, the moment of the Incarnation, holds significance beyond comprehension. This moment was in the mind of the Father in Heaven from all eternity and took place in a hidden way, known only to this lowly and humble virgin.

As we celebrate this glorious solemnity, ponder all these central mysteries of our faith. Faith must be celebrated, not only believed. It must be proclaimed, rejoiced in, loved, and lived. Profess your faith in the Incarnation and seek the intercession of the Virgin Mary. Ask her to pray for you that you may imitate her "Yes" to the will of the Father in Heaven, so that you can continue to bring forth His divine Son in your soul, so that He will continue to be made manifest to the world through you. *My Catholic Life*
