

#### **December 25: The Nativity of the Lord (Solemnity)** (Holy Day of Obligation)

On this day, the Church focuses especially on the newborn Child, God become human, who embodies for us all the hope and peace we seek. We need no other special saint today to lead us to Christ in the manger, although his mother, Mary and Joseph, caring for his foster-son, help round out the scene. But if we were to select a patron for today, perhaps it might be appropriate for us to imagine an anonymous shepherd, summoned to the birthplace by a wondrous and even disturbing vision in the night, a summons from an angelic choir, promising peace and goodwill. A shepherd willing to seek out something that might just be too unbelievable to chase after, and yet compelling enough to leave behind the flocks in the field and search for a mystery. On the day of the Lord's birth, let's let an unnamed, "non-celebrity" at the edge of the crowd model for us the way to discover Christ in our own hearts—somewhere between skepticism and wonder, between mystery and faith. And like Mary and the shepherds, let's treasure that discovery in our hearts. Franciscan Media

#### **December 26: St. Stephen, The First Martyr (Feast)**

St. Stephen is called the "Protomartyr," which means "first martyr". He was the first person to die for his faith in Jesus Christ. His martyrdom showed early Christians the importance of standing firm in their faith, even when facing danger. His courage gave strength and hope to the growing Church. His death also had a strong impact on Saul, who later became Saint Paul. Saul was present at Stephen's stoning, watching over the cloaks of those who threw stones. His brave witness and prayer for forgiveness planted seeds that later led to Paul's conversion. St.Stephen's feast day is December 26, the day after Christmas. It is a day to honour his sacrifice and celebrate his faith. In some traditions, it is known as "Boxing Day" or "St. Stephen's Day". People remember him with prayers, Mass, and acts of charity. St. Stephen is the patron saint of deacons, stone masons, and those who face persecution. His story encourages Christians to live with courage, compassion, and trust in God. Young Catholics

#### **December 27: St. John, Apostle, Evangelist (Feast)**

When two young Jewish fishermen sat by the Sea of Galilee, mending their nets with their father, a man walked by and said, "Follow me". Their response

reveals the startled glimmer of recognition they must have had in that moment: "Immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him" (Mt 4:22). In this rabbi who was calling them, James and John, the sons of Zebedee - tradition holds that John was the younger of the two – caught a glimpse of something for which, as faithful Israelites, they had been waiting all their lives.

John must have often gone back in his mind to that moment when he left his nets to follow the Messiah. Yet during his three years at Jesus' side, watching him pray, teach, raise a dead child, and calm the wind and the waves, the fisherman could not have imagined that one day he would watch his Master die on a cross. He could not have known that, as he saw his friend's body placed in the tomb, the words he had learned as a Jewish child would take on an infinitely greater meaning: "Your face, O Lord, I seek; hide not your face from me" (Ps 27:8-9).




